

# Quilted Christmas Stocking

Spread the joy this Christmas with your very own custom stocking! Use your favourite fabrics and buttons to create a personalised stocking for that special someone.

## Materials

- Your choice of Christmas fabrics for hexagons and backing fabric
- Felt/wool/faux fur for cuff
- Sew Easy Batting
- Hemline Christmas Buttons
- Sew Easy 2.5" Quilting Paper Pieces
- Thread
- Scissors
- Boot pattern found below (print on A4 paper)

## Method

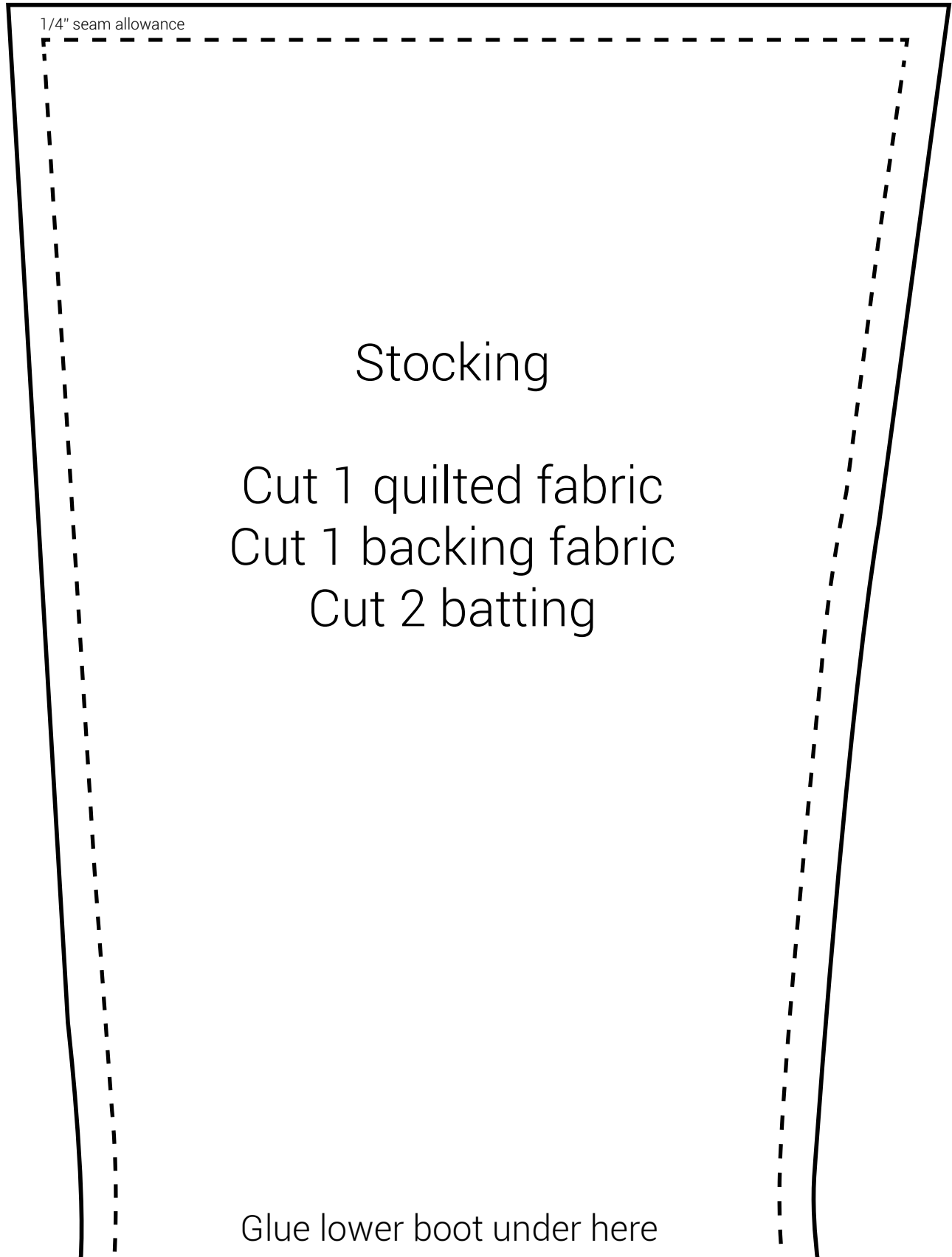
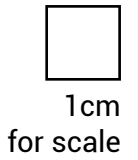
Please note: 1/4-inch seam allowances are used throughout these instructions. Press after each step.

1. Lay chosen fabric out and using Sew Easy 2.5" Paper Pieces trace around the outside with a fabric pencil. Cut out fabric hexagons. Using the templates below, also cut out 2x batting (remember to flip the template after you cut one OR cut folded) and 1x cuff.
2. Pick up two hexagons and face right sides together. To accurately align your two hexagons, stick a pin straight through a corner on both hexagons. Repeat the same for an adjacent corner. From there, pin the edge between the two corners properly and sew together.
3. Repeat the above step and begin creating rows consisting of approximately 3 hexagons. You will need a row or two to consist of 4-5 hexagons for the bottom of the stocking where it is wider.
4. Begin joining the rows together by placing one row of hexagons on top of another with right sides together. Like step 2, push a pin through the corners to align the hexagons properly. Sew together carefully, remembering to press your seams afterwards.
5. Once all of your hexagon rows are sewn together, place the boot template over the top of your fabric. Trace with a fabric marker and cut carefully.
6. Hand-sew your chosen buttons on to the middle of the hexagons.
7. With right sides facing, pin and sew the quilted front panel and backing fabric together, leaving the top open. Put aside.
8. Pin the batting together and sew along the edges, leaving the top and an approx 10cm gap at the bottom open. Put aside.
9. With your cuff fabric, fold short sides together with right sides facing. Sew along the edge to make a loop. Fold the cuff in half lengthways with raw edges touching and put aside.
10. With some left over fabric, cut a strip of fabric approximately 10 x 5cm to create a hanging loop for your boot. Fold the fabric in half lengthways and sew along the edge. Turn right side out.
11. Place cuff on top of the stocking, lining up the raw edges. Place your hanging loop at your desired location (usually on the back or just off to the side). Pin together.
12. Place your stocking inside the batting (the batting should be wrong-side out). Line up raw edges and re-pin the top once everything is aligned. Sew along top edge of stocking to attach all of your layers together.
13. Turn the stocking right side out through the hole left in the bottom of the batting. Either hand-stitch or top stitch batting closed.
14. Hang your new stocking and fill it with lots of goodies!

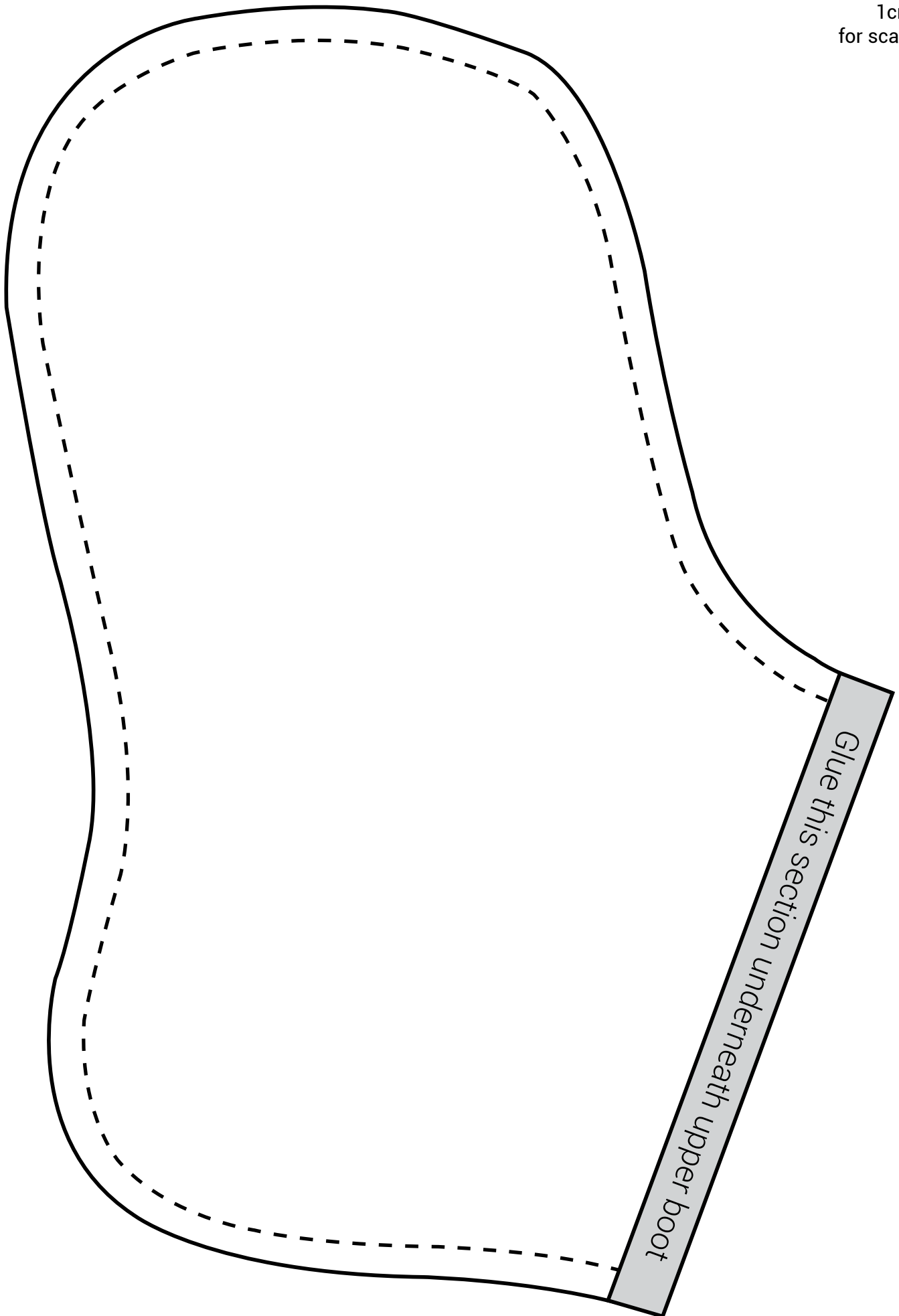
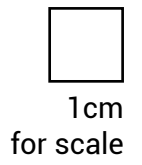


Finished size:
